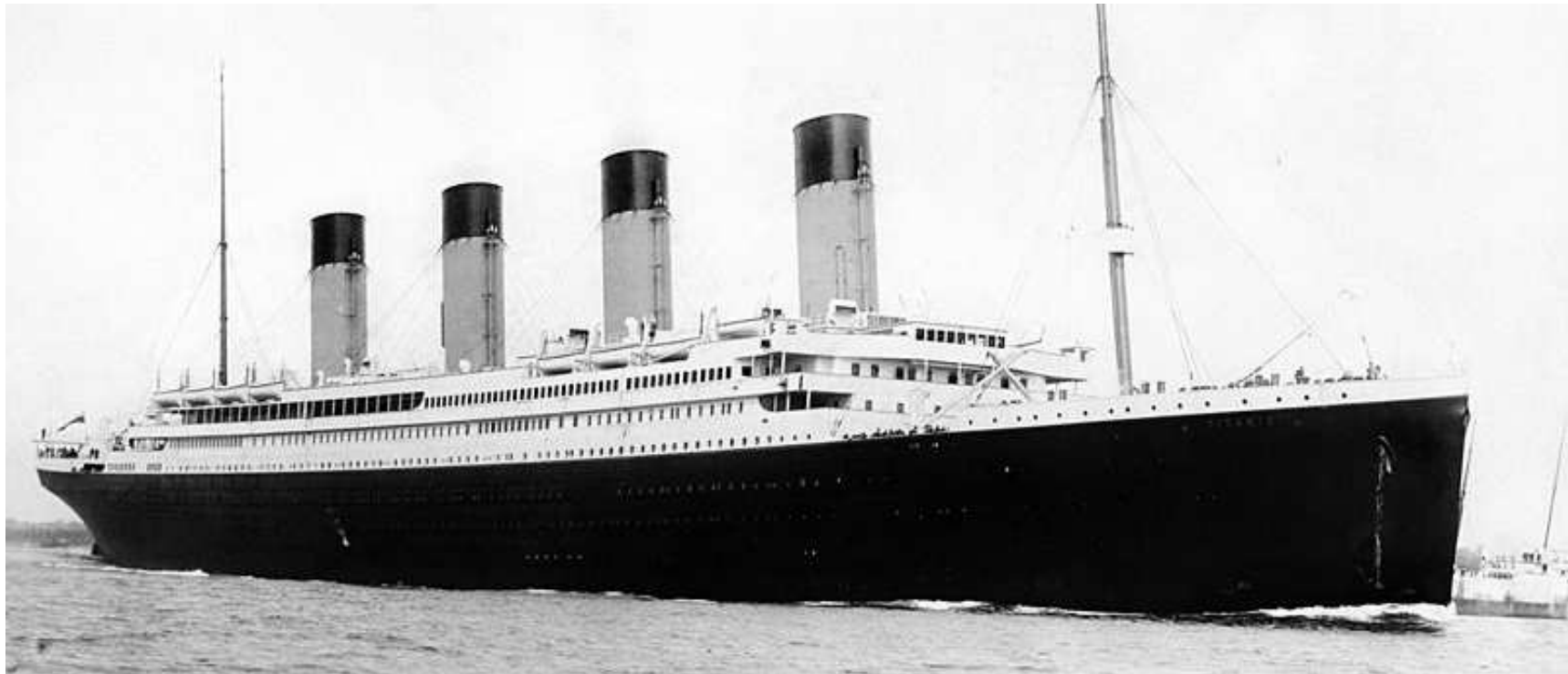

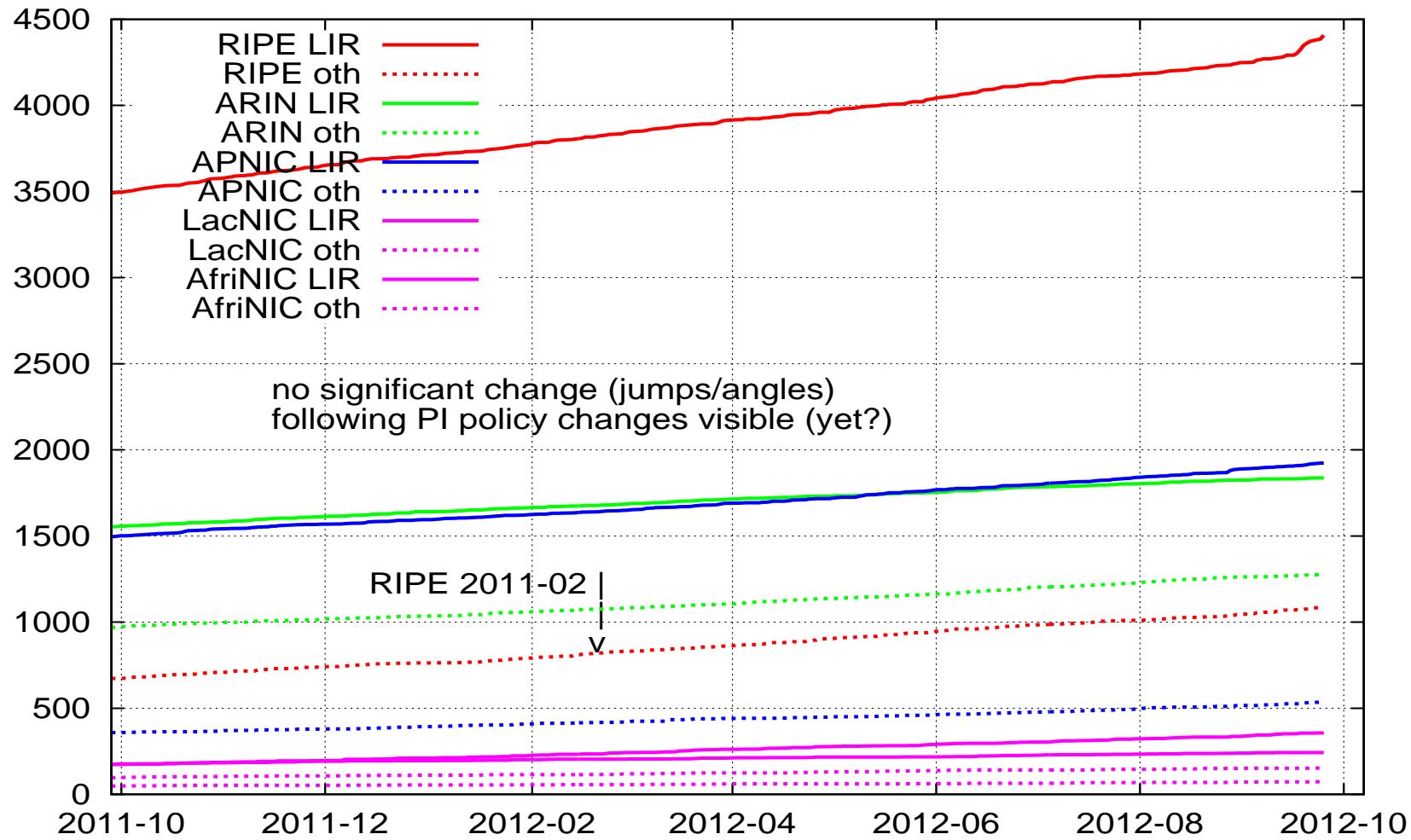
- IPv4 maintenance policy (Rob Blokzijl)
 - after IPv4 exhaustion, half of the RIPE IPv4 policy text no longer applies
 - stronger focus to registration of resources (transfers...)
 - re-write of policy texts
 - postponed until dust from IPv4 exhaustion settles ⇒ RIPE66

H. update on ongoing policy projects

- IPv6 PA/PI unification policy (Gert Döring)
 - unify IPv6 PA and IPv6 PI into “address blocks”
 - get rid of unexpected restrictions on “addresses”
 - simplification of things can get surprisingly complicated
 - got stuck in IPv4 run out hectic, expect document “soon”

2012-05

- new text added to the transfer policy (5.5):

“The RIPE NCC will record the change of allocation after the transfer. The RIPE NCC will publish a list of all allocations transferred under this section and a list of all requested transfers that were not approved after their need was evaluated. The list will be updated monthly and will contain the transferring organization’s name, the block originally held by the transferor, and, if the transfer was approved, the organization name(s) to which the block(s) were transferred, each subdivided prefix (each partial block derived from that original block) transferred under this policy, and the date each prefix was transferred. ”
